In order to offer a vibrant student experience, we must strive to offer: (1) a safe and secure environment, (2) state-of-the-art infrastructure and facilities, (3) a wide-range of extracurricular activities and athletic offerings, (4) dedication to multicultural inclusion and diversity.
4. **Improve Operational Vitality-** Trinity must operate from a position of financial strength. This includes enhancing enrollment and development activities, properly managing school resources, and a building a culture of fiscal responsibility. Trinity must strengthen its place in Manchester by forging relationships within the community, parishes, and feeder schools.
5. **Attain Affordability For All-** As a school deeply rooted in Catholic ideals, Trinity will be committed to the premise that all children, regardless of their background, have the right to pursue and achieve academic excellence.
